

3. The training of teachers is normally a Government responsibility, although in this case the University must continue to bear its share of the burden it assumed in 1907.

4. In 1925 the Protestant Committee of the Council of Public Instruction approved the grant of \$25,000. to the School.

A second difficulty has been raised. It is stated that the teachers trained at Macdonald are not teaching in the Province of Quebec. This may have been so in the past. We were bound to accept all students who offered themselves for training, but the University has no control over their subsequent employment. It is possible that many of these teachers were unable to obtain positions in Quebec.

We are all looking forward to a great period of prosperity for Quebec,- increasing population and increasing openings for teachers. We must prepare ourselves to meet them and I am confident that the Protestant minority will continue to receive the fair treatment which has always been one of our subjects of pride.
