the greater State, was, by His Majesty's Appointment, conveyed by Torch-light from his Lodgings to Westminster-Abbay, where he was buried near his beloved Master King James, coming to the Grave in peace, and in a good old Age, without being Witness to those Calamities, which afterward happened to his Country, whose Affairs, by long Experience, he knew as well as any Man whatsoever. Over his Grave was erected a decent Marble Monument, with this inscription.
