

of the flesh, need to be born again and matured, and when maturity is reached that which is flesh or the material part of man will be fully transformed, even as the fleshly body of Jesus was transformed through the power that was given Him in answer to His strictly obedient, honest, and sinless life. "But as many as received Him" to them gave He power to become sons of God, "even to them that believe on His name: which" "were born not of blood, nor of the will of the" "flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God." Thus the whole man becomes perfect, and the Love and Wisdom of God flow through unhindered and unalloyed. The proof of the presence of the Christ—the Spiritul and the material—was thus made, and it was also shewn that man has a mind and a will separate from God, and yet united to Him.
