by an invariable established Rule of acting in our Council or Board of Trade, as Informations in any other Shape cannot be relied upon.

> And therefore, as is humbly conceived, it may be of great Use to the Publick to take a View of the usual Course of Proceeding in Committees of Council, before the constituting of a Council or Board of Trade in 1696, and of feveral other Regulations with respect to our Colonies.
