former has the air of a poor and cowardly yielding, leaving them all their force uncontrolled, and their league with France and Spain entire. The latter I think a dreadful alternative, for fhould the Thirteen Colonies be fevered from us, we may itill, perhaps, exift as a people, never as a great people. In the dying words of Lord Chatham, "*it is a total difinemberment of* the "British Empire; that empire which his "Majesty received entire from his progeni-"tors, and which was guaranteed to the "heirs of the Princess Sophia." "The "Prince of Wales (he faid) might demand "his inheritance."

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In fhort, Sir, it is a ftep I think little fhort of defpair fhould drive us to, and nothing without an abfolute renunciation of their league with the Houfe of Bourbon.

As to the other, of offering no conditions at all, whoever thinks this is a wound enfe recidendum, to be cured by the fword alone, errs fatally in my opinion; we have tried that
