I.C.R. IS MAKING CHANGES BIG SAVING IN COAL BILLS

By Water Hauling in Summer Months
Lop \$750,000 Yearly
Off Expenses.

Ottawa, Feb. 19.—A reform in the coal arrangements for the Intercolonial is to be made which, it is estimated, will save from three-quarters to a million dollars a year in the cost of operating the road.

The coal for the line is now all hauled from Cape Breton. It is proposed to erect coal handling facilities at River Au Loup, Campbellton, New Brunswick, and at other points along the coast. For distances above two hundred miles the rates are low. It is intended to increase them to the standard of the C.P.R. and of the Grand Trunk.

The commercial travelers' rates will also be advanced to the scale which prevails on the other eastern roads.

YORK LOAN ASSETS.

Only Two of 60 Tenders for Houses Accepted

Sixty tenders submitted for the house property owned by the York County Loan & Savings Co. were opened yesterday morning by Neil McLean, official referee, in connection with the winding up of the company. After comparing the amounts offered with the valuations which the National Trust as liquidators put upon the properties, only two of the offers were accepted, although in view of the other offers received more sales might result after consultation in private negotiation.

\$30,000 FOR THE PROVINCE.

Through the cancellation of pulp concessions recently announced the Ontario government stands to benefit \$30,000 in cash. The Montreal River Pulp Co. had on deposit \$30,000, and the Dryden and Rainy River Pulp Co. \$5000 each. This is confiscated because of alleged non-fulfillment of conditions of concession. Companies interested had concessions which were granted before deposits were required by the government.

Further efforts to secure government assistance for drainage in the Township of Raleigh, Kent County, were made yesterday when H. S. Clements, M.P. West Kent; J. M. Pike, Chatham; James Wellwood, Raleigh; T. A. Pardo, Raleigh, reeve, called upon Mr. J. H. Whitney at the parliament buildings and received the usual promise of consideration.

Writ Against Estate.
St. Catharines, Feb. 19.—The Ontario government have, it is reported, issued a writ against the estate of the late S. D. Woodruff, who died here about a year ago, for payment of the succession duties. The Woodruff was reported to be worth several millions there has never been any appraisal of the property. It is said that a great deal of the estate consists of United States bonds.

HOUSE 8:15 TO 10:15 EX-PREMIER SPEAKS TO-DAY

Mr. Ross Will Give Luncheon to
Opposition Members Thursday
and Caucus Follows.

The legislature had practically nothing to do yesterday, and it was done in less than five minutes. Few members were in place. To-day the debate on the address will be continued by the opposition order, and then it is expected Mr. Whitney will conclude the debate before 6 o'clock.

COBALT COMPANY HITS BACK WHILE SUE THE GOVERNMENT

Sue to Attorney General's Writ
to Oust the White Silver Mining Company.

The White Silver Company, Edward C. Hargrave, Frank R. Rutherford and Charles Gunning Williams, are attempting to get back at the attorney-general and the department of crown lands because of the suit issued by the authorities, alleging irregularities in connection with the registration of a claim in the Cobalt district. A suit for \$25,000 was entered against the attorney-general and the department of crown lands.

The mining men set forth that the department of crown lands interfered with the regularity of the application at the time of a transfer of part of the claim to Hargrave. It is to this time no claim was made by right of discovery and was those of Hargrave, Rutherford and Williams.

Among the allegations made in the statement for the company is one which reads: "The complainants were lodged in the institution of R. J. Tough and J. C. McMillan, who were desirous of the said land and acquiring title thereto. Immediately after the caution was secured they trespassed on the lands and made an application for a title thereto."

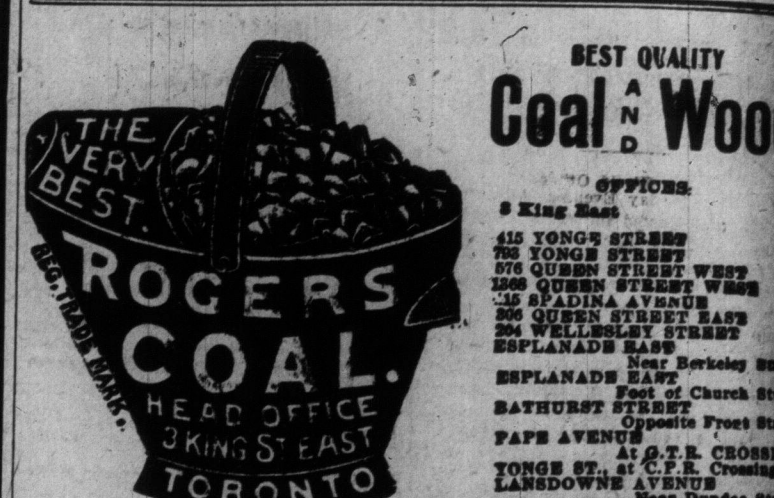
