Belleville, March 27.—(Special.)—The spring assizes opened this afternoon before Chief Justice Falconbridge. The grand jury was selected, J. K. McCarran, ex foreman. The judge addressed the grand jury on the unusual fact that three murder cases would be brought before them.

In the case of Ferdinand Kleingbeil, he said it should not take them long to arrive at a conclusion. The accused was charged with killing his wife by beating her with his fists, and witness would swear that they heard him claim that he caused his wife's injuries, if he had to hang for it.

With the snows that farrow early, care must be taken to keep the pigs warm. It is comparatively easy to start the early pigs, and once started they never fully recover from the effects. Pigs that have been wintered over should have never been pushed as rapidly as possible now in order to fatten before hot weather sets in. It rarely pays to attempt to fatten hogs in summer.
