PREMIER ROSS' SURPLUS. He Puts it at \$1,618,000 and Believes His Figures are Correct. Premier Ross claims the province has a large surplus. The receipts for 1899 were \$3,510,000, the expenditure \$2,700,000 and the balance \$1,810,000. The expenditure included railway subsidy fund \$128,000, annuities \$103,000 and drainage \$269,000.

Chicago, Jan. 18.—Sir Thomas Lipton, owner of last year's America's Cup challenger Shamrock, has applied for membership in the Chicago Board of Trade. Sir Thomas has owned and operated a meat preserving and pork packing plant at the stock yards for several years, but heretofore has had no membership in the Board of Trade, being represented by managers of his Chicago office.

TRIAL OF TROLEY MAURDER

Justice Falconbridge Addressed the Grand Jury on Their Duties Concerning the Matter.

COMPANY SHOULD BE CAREFUL. What is a Reasonable Rate of Speed is a Question for the Jury.

Mr. Justice Falconbridge yesterday morning addressed the Criminal Assize Court grand jury on their duties in dealing with the indictment which charged Motorman Robert Fewster and Livery Driver Arthur Kinisela with killing Mrs. Hattie Rogers.

Company Must be Careful in Operating Electric Cars. It has not the exclusive right to the car tracks, and a traveler is not a trespasser thereon if he uses them reasonably. He must, however, get out of the way in time, as the car has the superior right of way.

Driver's Negligence. The court claimed any negligence on his part would not absolve the motorman from blame. A livery driver must take every precaution for the safety of his passengers, and the charge that a free bill had been found against Kinisela and no bill in the case of Fewster.

ONLY TWO CONTESTS. Six Dominion Bye-Election Nominations and Four Elections by Acclamation.

Nominations for Dominion bye-elections took place yesterday in one Ontario and five Quebec constituencies, and in four Indian reserves members were elected by acclamation.
