Buffalo, Dec. 5.—The incorporation in this State of the Niagara Transfer Company, Buffalo, to construct a steam railroad between Tonawanda and Buffalo, and the application filed at Ottawa by the Niagara Grand Island Bridge Company for an extension of time in which to complete its works, taken in connection with the fact that Canadian engineers have been making a survey of the land on the Canadian side of Niagara River, opposite the north end of Grand Island, have given rise to many rumors.

It is stated that a western road will seek entrance to Buffalo thru the Province of Ontario, that a new bridge will be built across the Niagara River at Tonawanda, and that the Niagara Transfer Railway will be the connecting link with an eastern road.
