Heat in Australia.

Temperature 124 in the Shade—People Prostrated.

Enormous Damage by Fire—Spontaneous Combustion Destroys Houses, Barns and Crops—Many Suffocated in Melbourne.

Vancouver, B. C., Feb. 4.—Prostrations by heat are so numerous in Australia, the steamer reports, that the situation in large cities is alarming. The same condition prevails in the colonies. The thermometer during the heat of the day averages about 124 in the shade, and in the heat of the sun it reaches 150, so it is impossible to work at sundry and sleep at night. The heat has caused numerous deaths from spontaneous combustion, and the in the worst sections the residents try to sleep in gardens and on roofs. The damage from fire will amount to millions of dollars. In Victoria colony 100,000 acres have been swept clear and an enormous acreage of crops destroyed.

In other colonies houses and barns have been burned.

Inspector Mosep, of the board of public works, and a large gang of men went to inspect a sewer. A workman who followed them came back saying that Mosep and all the gang had been overcome by sewer gas.

Hundreds of citizens crowded around the vent-hole, but none dared try to rescue them, though all knew the men were dying beneath their feet. The sewer region, where the men were in, was flooded by the fire department, but the pressure was so strong it was impossible to unfathom the vent-hole, and the gas was secured by men. Divers were then secured by a rope, and the bodies of all the men to the surface. Many had families and all were young.

Fifty of the Corona's Passengers Remain on Lewis Island.

Lucky Strike Made in the Klondike by a Michigan Man.

Details of the U. S. Relief Expedition Completed.

Fort Wrangel, Jan. 28—via Seattle, Wash., Feb. 3.—The steamer Oregon, of the Portland-Alaska line, on her way to Alaska, anchored off Lewis Island and rescued the passengers of the wrecked Corona, who were not taken off by the Alki last Thursday. The sea was choppy, and a fresh breeze was blowing from the direction of Dixon's entrance, but the transfer of men, women and children and personal baggage was made with efficiency. One of the ship's boats, which was in charge of the second officer of the Oregon, drifted off four miles down the straits, and was not picked up for five hours. The occupants, several men and women, and a baby, suffered considerably from the cold and were well exhausted.

About 50 of the Corona's passengers were left on the island. They would not go on the Oregon unless Capt. Stephens would agree to take all their baggage, outfits and animals. They had about 200 tons of supplies on the beach. As it would take several days to get all the stuff aboard, Capt. Stephens would not comply with the request. The people left on the island were supplied with provisions, tents and bedding. They will probably stay there until some boat comes along and picks them up.

Clayton, Feb. 3.—Isaac Mallette, who is now in the Klondike gold country, has written to his family in Hull, stating that he had made his fortune. He had two valuable claims, which he sold to syndicates of capitalists for a large sum. He also mentioned that a man from Ottawa named "Land" had been in the Klondike, and is doing nicely.

Jackson, Mich., Feb. 3.—Edward Seaf, chief of the detective bureau of Seattle, a former Jackson man, Klondike, last August Mr. Cuddehe "grub-staked" him with \$500 worth of dogs, guns and provisions. Egan is now in Seattle, and Mr. Cuddehe writes that he has secured claims for which he was offered \$50,000. Cuddehe is an athlete, who has never been thrown on his back, and carries a gold medal given "for person of bravery and single-handed capturing John Mahan, a desperado, who had up to the night of his capture killed four men."

Washington, Feb. 3.—Gen. Merriam, commanding the department of Columbia, has notified the chief of the details of the relief expeditions to be sent out by the government to the gold region in Alaska and to the Klondike. Major J. L. Tucker, Fourth Cavalry, is assigned to the command at Dyea, where he is to establish a camp and supply depot. Capt. R. H. Ruel, assistant quartermaster, is designated as quartermaster and commissary of the expedition. Capt. L. Brainerd has also been assigned to duty at Dyea as purchasing and disbursing officer of the expedition. Capt. Bogardus is assigned to duty at Dyea as quartermaster, with a detachment of men of the Fourteenth Infantry, together with First Lieut. F. M. Keith, assistant surgeon, and two enlisted men of the hospital corps, fully armed and equipped for escort duty in the interior of Alaska, with 100 rounds of rifle ammunition per man, are ordered to proceed from Dyea to Fairbanks by the steamer, First Lieut. Guy H. Pearson of the Ninth Cavalry, in charge, with Lieut. Jas. A.
