

The fact occasions no surprise at the capital, which entertained no illusions whatever as to the change in administration which might be looked for from the "new" National Liberal and Conservative party under the new Conservative leader.

FILMS OF STEPHENS' FATAL PLUNGE MAY PROVIDE FOR WIDOW




