

WINNIPEG WHEAT PRICES EASE OFF

Futures Open Strong, But Close About Two Cents

Winnipeg, March 29.—After the stronger opening in today's market, which sent May wheat to \$1.83, the high of the day, values eased off and fell to \$1.80%. Prices held firm and closed fractionally higher for May, with July $\frac{1}{8}$ c lower.

A continued excellent demand from American millers was evident in the cash markets, and the premiums advanced one cent. At one time during the session cash wheat was quoted at \$1.96½, the highest for weeks, but little changed hands at this figure. Trade was not large, with a little wheat changing hands sold to be for outside short account. The coarse grains continue very dull, fluctuating to some extent with wheat.

Stocks are liberal, with a limited volume of business passing. Oats closed $\frac{5}{8}$ c $\frac{1}{2}$ c lower; barley, $\frac{1}{8}$ c higher to unchanged; flax, $\frac{1}{4}$ c lower to $\frac{1}{4}$ c higher; and rye 2c lower.
