NEED NO FAVORS FROM THE STATES

Montreal Board of Trade Turns Down Invitation to Detroit to Discuss Reciprocity with U.S.

Montreal, Que., April 22.—(Special)—Vigorous efforts are being made by the Montreal board of trade to prevent the bar association of the city from getting the provincial legislation passed, which will make collection agencies illegal.

The board of trade has also sharply turned down overtures from Detroit to send a representative to their meeting to be held there, to discuss commercial reciprocity between the states and Canada.

The representatives of the metropolis businessmen declared that the time had passed when Canada needed this, and that they were satisfied with the present trend of business to Great Britain, and other foreign countries.
