### McGoorty to Australia

Ed McGoorty, who sailed for Australia the other day, told some truths about the game before leaving.

"The boxing game hasn't the hold on the people that it formerly had," he said. "I can sense it and I think I know the reason. I guess the commercialism that has come into boxing has taken away the spirit of the contest. Fight fans are no longer fooled by the talk about knocking off this fellow's block or words to that effect."

"Neither are the fans deluded by the champions and near champions insisting on having their own referee officiate in the bouts they engage in at the different cities. That also has hurt the game, for they know it is a financial proposition with us fellows in the ring."

"Then, too, there isn't any question that decisionless matches have had a bad effect. Take Freddie Welsh as an example. He has taken part in fifty or more of these verdictless bouts in which there has been a mighty small chance of his losing his title. If there is something hinging on the outcome, it would be different. The loss of California as a state where twenty-round bouts could be held was the worst possible blow. It has brought the making of new champions almost to a standstill. Things will have to change if there is to be any future to pugilism."
