#### GERMANS KILL AN AMERICAN IN NEUTRAL ZONE

California Soldier and Campanion  
Had been Deer Hunting When  
Hun Patrol Was Encountered

Coblenz, Sept. 8.—(By the Associated  
Press).—Private Reass Madsen, of Sacra-  
mento, Cal., was shot and killed on Tues-  
day by German soldiers in the neutral  
zone about a mile from the boundary of  
the Coblenz bridgehead.

Madsen and Private Balsinger, of the  
Eighth Infantry, who had been on out-  
post duty, were deer hunting when they  
encountered a German patrol of thirteen  
soldiers. According to Balsinger, the  
Germans began firing without asking an  
explanation as to why the two Amer-  
icans were in the neutral zone. Balsinger  
was taken prisoner by the Germans and  
Madsen fired at them. Balsinger declar-  
ed that the Germans fired first.
