GERMANS KILL AN AMERICAN IN NEUTRAL ZONE

California Soldier and Campaigner Had been Deer Hunting When Hun Patrol Was Encountered

Coblenz, Sept. 8.—(By the Associated Press)—Private Reass Madsen, of Sacra-mento, Cal., was shot and killed on Tues-day by German soldiers in the neutral zone about a mile from the boundary of the Coblenz bridgehead.

Madsen and Private Balsinger, of the 10th Infantry, who had been on out-post duty, were deer hunting when they encountered a German patrol of thirteen soldiers. According to Balsinger, the Germans began firing without asking an explanation as to why the two Amer-icans were in the neutral zone. Balsinger was taken prisoner by the Ger-mans and later turned over to the American provost marshal and brought to Coblenz. The Germans contend that Madsen fired at them. Balsinger de-clared that the Germans fired first.
