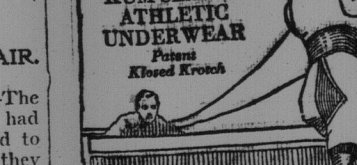
#### Welcomed to Peru.

#### MILLION FOR WAR RELIEF

WORK VOTED BY ELKS

Atlantic City, N. J., July 12—The Grand Lodge of the Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks, its golden jubilee convention appropriated \$1,000,000 for war relief.

The election resulted in a victory for the organization forces led by ex-Governor John K. Tener of Pennsylvania and defeat for the progressives headed by "Jerry" Hermann. Grand Secretary Frederick Robinson of Dubuque, Ia., was elected president of the convention.

The Elks' fight for the presidency of Cincinnati, but they lost by a vote of 308 to 182. The fight for the presidency was somewhat closer, Charles A. White of Chicago defeating P. J. Brennan of Denison, Texas, by a vote of 279 to 268. This is Mr. White's sixth term.

There was no opposition to the election of Bruce A. Campbell of East St. Louis, Ill., as grand exalted ruler. The other officers were—Grand Exalted Leading Knight, Thomas L. Riley of New London, Conn.; Grand Exalted Loyal Knight, O. K. Cowell of Sanbury, Conn.; Grand Exalted Lecturing Knight, E. L. Chapman, Great Bend, Kan.; Grand Tiler, C. B. Horn, Colorado Springs; Grand Inner Guard, H. W. Brown, Santa Monica, Cal.; Grand Trustee, (for five years), C. F. J. McQuinn, Cambridge, Mass.; and (for one year), W. F. Deidman, Albany, N. Y.

A cable message from General Pershing to his fellow Elks was read at the meeting.

The candidacy of Albert T. Brophy of Brooklyn, La., for grand exalted ruler in 1919, developed rapidly and is apparently meeting with general approval. Mr. Brophy has been appointed chief justice of the highest tribunal within the order, the Supreme Court of Elks, comprised of five members.

Paris, July 12—Admiral Adrien Ruyet, minister of marine, died yesterday, aged eighty.

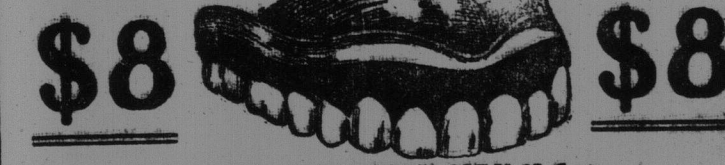
### AT A MEETING OF THE ST. JOHN COUNTY
