SALARIES OF MODEL SCHOOL INSTRUCTORS. Board of Education Fixes Scale—Government Business Here. Members of the provincial government were in the city yesterday to attend meetings of the government and boards of which they are members. At a government meeting in the morning routine matters were discussed. There was a session of the provincial board of education in the afternoon, when the resignation of Dr. D. W. Hamilton from the staff of the Normal school at Fredericton was accepted. He will take the place of the late Dr. Brittain on the staff of the Macdonald College at St. Anne de Bellevue. F. A. Good, of the staff of the Fredericton High school, was appointed to succeed Dr. Hamilton in the Normal school. The salaries of the teachers in the model school at Fredericton were rearranged. The principal is to get \$1,200. He teaches grades seven and eight. Miss Harvey, who has been on the staff for many years, is to receive \$700. The salaries of the others are to be as follows: Miss McLaughlin, \$700; Miss Golding, \$700; Miss Baxter, \$600; and Miss Wathen, \$750. The last two were assistants in the manual training department. A new school manual is to be issued in a month or two and arrangements are to be made by a committee appointed by the board. Other matters of a routine character were discussed. Dr. Cartier, chief superintendent of education, will remain in the city for several days. He is to address the Teachers' Association on Friday evening and will also visit the Boys' Industrial Home as well as several of the city schools. The director of the River Glade Sanitarium met last evening, but only routine business was transacted. There are now five patients in the pavilion and it is expected that several more will soon be received.

Daily Hints For the Cook. This is made by paring and coring tart apples into a deep baking dish, add a bit of salt and sugar, sugar to sweeten to taste, or part molasses can be used if used. Add water and bake till the apples get a nice red. It is better to cover while baking. Then make a nice short biscuit crust and lay on top and bake until brown. Break the crust down into the apple and serve with any sweet sauce. AFFINITY PRUNES. Soak French prunes two hours in cold water, then simmer gently until soft enough to remove the stones. Then cover with sherry wine and let stand several hours. When ready to serve stuff with chopped pecans and marshmallows that are cut up fine. Roll in confectioner's sugar. Pile on a flat dish and cover with sweetened cream, whipped if cinnamon may be added, if liked, to spice.
