Session of 1876-77.

The Tenth Session will commence at the Halifax Medical College on Tuesday, the 24th of October, 1876, with a general introductory lecture. The regular lectures will commence on Wednesday, the 25th of October, and will be continued during the six months following.

All Students are required at the beginning of the Session or as soon afterwards as possible, to register their names with the Registrar, Dr. A. P. Reid. The time fixed for closing the register is the 30th of November in each year.

The class tickets are issued by the Registrar. Payment being always made in advance. In no case are tickets issued before registration nor after the closing of the register.

The courses of Lectures have been accepted by the general Medical Council of Great Britain, and by the Medical Schools on this Continent.

Guided by past experience the Faculty have decided to hold written Sessional Examinations twice during each Session. Attendance upon them being compulsory.

These examinations are only auxiliary to and do not take the place of the Pass Examinations in the primary and final subjects. Except that in Botany which if satisfactory will be final.

Students of Dentistry will find it of advantage to attend the lectures of Chemistry, Anatomy, and Practical Anatomy.
