## THE RICHEST GOLD LAND.

**MARVELOUS WEALTH OF EAST AND SOUTH AFRICA.**  
The Source of Solomon's and Sheba's Vast Treasures—Concerns the Bible.  
Dr. Carl Peters, the fierce, resolute little explorer, whom Germany has to thank to-day for most of her East African possessions, is getting ready to go back to the scene of the battle, triumph, defeat and discovery that has made his life for the last eighteen years more exciting than a romance, says a London correspondent.
