MINING STOCK IS SOLD AT AUCTION

Blocks of a Thousand Shares go for Twenty-five Cents—Three Tugs Also Disposed of.

Stock in different mining companies was the chief attraction at Chubb's Corner last Saturday when many people purchased hundreds of shares for a few cents. F. L. Potts offered for sale a farm owned by Abraham W. Orchard, situated in Queens county. The farm contained 107 acres and was sold to satisfy a mortgage claim. A. Wilson bought the property on a bid of \$450. T. T. Lantaulum sold the tugs Captain, Sea King and Champion, belonging to Tapley Bros. to E. Weyman. The Captain brought \$200, the Sea King \$250 and the Champion \$1800. A new in Centenary church was disposed of for \$105.
