## MR. GREGORY'S LETTER; MR. STYMEST'S REPLY

Mr. Gregory Criticises Secretary-Treasurer of Lancaster Highway Board and Mr. Stymest Replies

Fairville, N. B., Oct. 17, 1913.  
To the Editor of The Standard.

Sir—Will you kindly allow me to say a few words in reply to Mr. Stymest's letter of the 14th inst. in which he criticises my report of 1912 in full as signed by myself and Messrs. Bryant and Golding. The only difference of opinion there is between Mr. Stymest and myself is in what he claims to be assets and liabilities. The liabilities as contained in the report of 1912 are as follows:

\$2,292.29

The above report was sworn to by Messrs. Stymest, Golding and Bryant, before Justice Masson.

I also published what Mr. Stymest claims to be the assets of the parish, because to a large extent I knew they were not true. Take for instance, they claimed that the street railway owed them \$425 before the 31st of October. This is not correct. Further than this, they received \$850 for the year commencing Nov. 1st, 1911, and ending October 31st, 1912.

The Highway Board also claims that the government owes them \$525. I have examined the Chief Commissioner's report and can find nothing to this effect.

The claim of delinquent taxes which is \$2,541.83, seems to have been established by Mr. Stymest himself since he became secretary-treasurer of the Highway Board, which previous to this had never been claimed as an asset; as from year to year we have always had arrears of taxes, which to some extent cannot be collected. If it is to be considered an asset, we will have to take into consideration the fact that in 1911 he reports \$1,192 as the amount of delinquent taxes. Therefore by taking that amount from \$2,541.83 we find that \$1,349.83 would be the amount for 1912, half of which I venture to say cannot be collected.

I have printed a whole report of 1912 in the Evening Times of the 15th inst., as sworn to by Messrs. Stymest, Bryant and Golding, and I now leave it to the public to judge the matter for themselves.

In examining the report of 1911, I find the total expenditure was \$6,684.40. In 1912 according to my reckoning the total expenditure of Lancaster was \$11,232.47, showing an increase over 1911 of \$4,548.07.

If we would accept Mr. Stymest's whole statement as correct, will he please explain why it took \$2,557.77 more to repair roads and sidewalks in 1912 than it did in 1911.

Mr. Stymest says in answer to the above that the street railway payment was due for the half-year ending Oct.

that he did not state that the local government owed the board \$525, but that it owed \$487.85, which was absolutely correct, and that Mr. Gregory cannot get his figures of \$11,232.47 without including both the bank overdraft of \$1,690.28 and the bills which were paid by it—an error which should not be made by a school boy let alone a man who seeks to be a councillor. If he says he spends \$100 for work and has \$5 in his pocket to pay it and borrows \$5 from a friend to make up the amount is it correct to say he has spent \$15? This is just what Mr. Gregory is saying in his attempt to mislead the people. As to the criticism that uncollected taxes should not be treated as the assets of the parish, Mr. Stymest's previous letter is a sufficient answer. From these uncollected taxes every dollar of the liability was paid before the 31st of October without any help from this year's taxes.
