GERMANS NOT READY TO BRUSSELS MEET

France Sees in Notice from Berlin an Attempt to Eyade Treaty Agreement.

Paris, Jan. 5—The French government today received notice that the German delegation was not ready to resume the reparations conference at Brussels on January 10, as had been.

No other date is suggested howeven, and the tendency here is to connect this posponement with the disarranment question, it being considered a natural sequence of the remarks made by Dr. Walter Simons, the German foreign minister of Ambassadar Lawrent in Berlin recently that in its cace upon the disbandment of the German police organizations might make the consideration of the reparations question at Brussels more difficult.
