

BONE SLICED OFF HIS HEAD TO FIX SKULL

Hit by Bullet When a Lad—
Hole Left in Top of
Head.

DELICATE OPERATION PROVED SUCCESSFUL

Pieces of Bullet Removed
and Hole in Skull Closed
Up.

Philadelphia, May 22.—Ten years ago when a boy of 14, Charles Newman, of Lacey, Pa., was accidentally shot in the head while on a hunting trip. The bullet, of .33 calibre, broke into pieces against his skull and three fragments lodged deeply in different parts of the brain.

In an operation that was performed soon afterward in Pittsburgh a piece of Newman's skull as large as the palm of a man's hand was removed and never replaced. The surgeons were unable to extract the pieces of lead without killing the patient.

For nearly ten years Mr. Newman, in a manner of speaking, lived "without a roof over his head." The scalp grew together over the large wound and hair over the scalp. But he suffered constantly from fainting spells and the left side of his body was partly paralyzed.

Operation Successful.

Last week Dr. Charles H. Frazier, noted brain surgeon of this city, operated upon Mr. Newman at his clinic in the University Hospital.

Dr. Frazier removed the three pieces of bullet. What is more remarkable, he also gave Mr. Newman a new top piece for his skull. The surgeon did by chiseling a layer of bone from the side of the patient's head and inserting it in the centre.

The scalp was then sewed up over the bone cover.

Mr. Newman was interviewed at the University Hospital. The patient said he felt better than he had in ten years. He was as happy and cheerful as it is possible to be for a healthy young man who has to stay in bed with a bandaged head.

Surgeons and physicians declared the operation was one of the most successful ever performed in the hospital. They said similar operations, though not quite the same, had been among the feats of famous surgeons in the war. But they added that nothing like the Frazier operation had ever been done in Philadelphia.

Mr. Newman, who is a salesman of electrical appliances, talked of his plans for the future. He expects to leave the hospital in two weeks, when, according to Dr. Frazier, he will be "a well young man."

"I am just aching for the day when I will be able to go back home," said the patient. "You know, it is no fun to be in bed, just waiting for a wound in your head to heal while you are perfectly healthy in every other way."

"I am going right back to work as soon as I leave here. Why, I expect to sell more goods than I ever did in my life. This bullet in my brain was a terrible handicap. It was under other things, but what do you expect? It was quite an operation. I was under ether three hours and a half. But, of course, I don't mind what little pain I have in the least. I think it is well worth it, don't you?"

"I tell you it is a wonderful feeling to know that you have a head like everybody else and not one with a large hole in the centre!"
