


DONATES TEN MILLION FOR MEDICAL RESEARCH.

Her course is charted around the Cape of Fresh Air, through the straits of Good Food and out into the high seas of Plenty of Sunshine. The open air school to which they belong is conducted the year round on this abandoned boat anchored at the foot of the Williamsburg Bridge, Brooklyn. It is maintained for the children who come from homes in which there is danger of tuberculosis.
 These sturdy little citizens and their schoolmates are among the reasons why the National Tuberculosis Association is anxious to make this year a banner year in the sale of Red Cross Christmas seals. The goal is set for more than \$6,500,000 to be obtained from the sale of the stickers to carry on the life-saving work.


MOVIE STAR AND HIS CHILDREN HAVING A GOOD TIME.
