MCDougALL, HECTOR FRANCIS, J.P. (*Cape Breton.*)

Grand parents from the Island of Barra, Scot. S. of Malcolm McDougall, merchant of Christmas Island, and Mary McNeil. B. at Christmas Island, Cape Breton, 6 June, 1848, and ed. there. M., at Arichat, C.B., 6 Sept., 1875, Christina, dau. of Allan Cameron, of Antigonish, N.S. Has been a J.P. since 1873. Sat. in Leg. Assem., N.S., from g.e. 1878 to June 1882. Was a mem. of the Ex. Council, N.S., from 22 Oct., 1878 to 23 May, 1882. An unsuccessful candidate for present seat in the Commons at g.e. 1882. Elected, July, 1884, on the appt. of the sitting mem. to the Senate. Re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative.—*Christmas Island, C.B., N.S.*

MCGREEVY, THOMAS. (*Quebec West.*)

B. in Quebec, 27 July, 1827, of Irish descent. M., 1867, Miss Woolsey, only dau. of the late John B. Woolsey, Esq. A contractor. Is a dir. of the St. Lawrence Steam Navigation Co., and of the Union Bank of Canada; a Commr. of the Quebec Turnpike Trust; a mem. of the Quebec Harbour Commission; Vice-Presdt. of the Locomotive Works, Kingston, and was formerly director of the North Shore Railway Co. Was a mem. of the City Council of Quebec from 1858 to 1864. Sat for Stadacona Div. in L.C. of the Province of Quebec from 1867 until the g.e. 1874, when he resigned, owing to the abolition of dual representation, to run for the Commons. First returned to Parl. for present seat at g.e. 1867, by acclamation; re-elected at g.e. 1872: again at g.e. 1874; and again, by acclamation, at g.e. 1878. Re-elected at g.e. 1882 and 1887. A Liberal Conservative.—*Esplanade, Quebec; Rideau Club; The Garrison Club, Quebec.*

McINTYRE, PETER ADOLPHUS, M.D., C.M. (*King's, P.E.I.*)

Paternal grandfather came from Long Island, Inverness-shire, Scot., about 1785, and settled at Cable Head, King's, P.E.I.; maternal great-grandfather fought under Wolfe at the taking of Quebec. Is a nephew of the Right
