fixty chains from the westerly point of the mouth of the River St. Maurice, on the eafterly fide by the faid River St Maurice, and on the westerly side by a line red. angular to the eforesaid rear line, running from a point therein at the distance of one hundred and fixty chains from the westerly bank of the said River St. Maurice until it fir kes the faid River St, Lawrence; and that the second and last of the faid Towns or Borroughs to be called the Town or Borrow of William Henry, shall comprehend all that tract or parcel of land (being part and parcel of the aforesaid County of Richelieu) bounded in front by the River Sorel, others wife called the River Richelieu or Chamb'y, in the rear by a line parallel to the easterly fide of the Royal Square of the faid Town at the distance of one hundred chains therefrom, on the northerly side by the River St. Lawrence, and on the foutherly fide by a line parallel to the foutherly fide of the Royal Square of the faid Town at the distance of one hundred and twenty chains therefrom, AND KNOW YE ALSO, That Our faid Lieutenant Governor hath also declared and appointed, and doth hereby declare and appoint that the several Counties of Cornwallis, Devon, Heriford, Dorchester, Buckinghamshire, Richelieu, Surrey, Kent, Huntingdon, York, Montreal, Effingham, Leinster, Warwick, St. Maurice. Hampshire, Quebec and Northumberland, afore mentioned, shall and may be represented in the Assembly of the said Province by two Members or Representatives to be duly cholen in and for each of the fame Counties respectively; and the Counties of Gaspé, Bedford and Orleans, by only one Member or Representative for each of the faid Counties respectively; and the Ciries or Towns of Que bec and Montreal respectively, by four Members or Representatives for each of the faid Cities or Towns, to wit, two for each Subdivision thereof respectively; and the Town or Borough of Three Rivers, by two Members or Representatives for the faid Town or Borough; and the Town or Borough of William Henry, by only one Member or Representative for the said Town or Borrough. Of which Oer loving Subjects and all others concerned are to take due notice and govern themselves accordingly.
