will have their part. The soldiers of Canada, along with
the young men of Britain, the United States and other
United Nations, are about to hurl themselves into a tornado
of fire in the invasion of the mainland of Europe. Many will
be called upon to lay down their lives in the cause of freedom.

The shock of the actual invasion is not the only thing that will be costly in men. There will have to be many hammer blows before the forces of the United Nations can finally smash the vest well disciplined armies of Germany, laying open the road to Berlin.

We have, moreover, no grounds for believing that
Japan will right with any less determination or any less
resourcefulness as she sees Germany staggering towards defeat.
Japan today is a mighty empire, still controlling great areas
taken from the forces of Britain, of the United States and
of Holland. In recent months, the forces of the United Nations
in the Pacific have inflicted many brilliantly executed blows
upon the Japanese. But the allied forces are still many
hundreds of miles from the mainland of Japan, and the vest
new overseas empire of Japan is still largely intact.
