

MR.ALEXANDER: Yes, but the land is of indifferent quality.

It might be that they will never be irrigated. There are only 23 persons on the Reserve.

MR.BALLS: The next is Lower Similkameen, Number 10A.

MR.ELLIS: Have you anything on that?

MR.BALLS: I have not been able to find any record registered.

The only ~~known~~ record which might be appurtenant to this Reserve is the Provincial record for Number 10 Reserve which we have just been dealing with from Jims Creek. The Indians are diverting water from Jims Creek in a northwesterly direction to land on the Reserve 10A.

I don't think our Provincial records specify any particular Reserve.

MR.ALEXANDER: It doesn't say anything about carrying water in a northwesterly direction either.

MR.BALLS: No, that is so.

MR.ALEXANDER: I think you had better get a record.

MR.BALLS: All right.

MR.ELLIS: Was 10A a Reserve in 1897?

MR.BALLS: Was it, Mr.Ball?

MR.BALLS: Yes, the same date as Number 10.

MR.ELLIS: What are you going to do, file an application?

MR.BALLS: File an application.

THE CHAIRMAN: From what?

MR.BALLS: Jims Creek or Paul Creek. The next is Lower Similkameen Number 10B.

MR.ELLIS: That is in the same position, is it not?

MR.BALLS: Yes. An application for water from a stream
