MR.ALEXANDER: Yes, but the land is of indifferent quality.

It might be that they will never be irrigated. There
are only 25 persons on the Reserve.

MR.BALLS: The next is Lower Similkameen, Number 10A.

MR. BLLIS: Have you anything on thet?

MR.BALLS: I have not been able to find any record segistered, record
The only immis which might be appurtenant to this Reserve is the Provincial record for Number 10 Reserve which we have just been dealing with from Jims Greek.
The Indians are diverting water from Jims Greek in a morthwestedy direction to land on the Reserve 10A.

I don't think our Provincial records specify my particular Reserve.

MR.ALMANDER: "t doesn't say snything about corrying water in a northwesterly direction either.

MR.BALIS: No, that is so.

MR. ALEXANDER: I think you had better get a record.

MR.BALLS: All right.

MRLLANS: Was 10A a Reserve in 1897?

MR.WLLIS: Wes 11, Mr.Ball?

MR.BALL: Yes, the same date as Number 10.

MR. HLLIS: What are you going to do, file an application?

MR.BALLS: File an application.

THE CHAIRMAN; Prom what?

MR.BALLS: Jime Greek or Paul Greek. The next is Lover Similkemeen Fumber 10D.

MR. BLLIS: That is in the same position, is it not?

MR.BALLS: Yes. An application for water from a stream

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
