I, Karl Watson, was inside my home on the afternoon of Sunday the third of August when I heard a crash. I then went outside ans saw my brother-in-law, Mr. James Crane, running across the field to a tree where a glider had crashed which is about 500 feet north west of the house. The time was about 1600 hours. When we got to the scene the pilot was in a sitting position at foot of tree, the glider was caught in the tree 10 or 15 feet above him. Immediately I went back to the house to see if the Doctor and Police had been phoned. The Police were here 10 or 15 minutes after they were phoned, and the Doctor arrived about five minutes after he was phoned. We did not attempt to move him before the doctor arrived.

- Q. Did you see the glider before the accident?
- A. No.
- Q. Did you see any gliders flying today?
- A. No.
- Q. Wesethere any thunder storms around that time?
- A. No the sky was clear.
- Q. Was there any wind?
- A. Yes, the wind was gusty.
- Q. Was the wind very strong?
- A. No, other than gusty.
