

6. If any member feel aggrieved by the decision of the Chair, he may, except as provided in Rule 4, appeal to the Association. The Chairman shall thereupon put the question thus: "Shall the decision of the Chair be sustained?"

7. The following motions shall not be debatable: "To adjourn;" "To resolve into Committee of the Whole;" "To lay on the table;" and "The previous question."

8. A motion to adjourn or to resolve into Committee of the Whole shall always be in order except when a member is in possession of the floor, when members are voting, when an adjournment or to resolve into Committee was the last motion, or when it has been decided to put the main question.

9. Motions shall take precedence in the following order:—

1. To adjourn.
2. To resolve into Committee.
3. To lay on the table.
4. The previous question.
5. Other motions and amendments in the reverse order of motion except as in the subjoined rule.

10. The previous question shall be put in this form: "Shall the main question be now put?" If this be affirmed, no further motions
