Sir,-I desire to anknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 3rd instant, in which you inquire under what conditions a member of the 3rd might stake a claim for gas and oil on the Caughunwaga Reserve. er of the Band A member of the Band would not be entitled to stake any such claim, and action could only be taken in accordance with the provisions of the Indian Act and of the Regulations approved by Order in Council and governing the disposition of the petroleum and natural mae rights on Indian Reserves. Any oil or one deposit is considered the property of the Band in common, and a surrender would first be necessary, to be followed by the leneing of such privileges in accordance with our regulations.
