THE CONVENT DE NOTRE DAME, a branch of the far famed "Villa Maria," the first Educational Institution conducted by the Daughters of the Venerable Marguerite Bourgeoys. It was founded in 1857, when the Saintly Bp. McDonald guided the destinies of the diocese of Charlottetown, and has since pursued, in an unpretentious way, a career of usefulness. This happy result has been attained chiefly through the persevering efforts and fostering care of his Lordships worthy successor, the Rt. Rev. Peter McIntyre who now exercises Episcopal Jurisdiction over P. E. Island.

The Convent we believe, has been justly favoured with the patronage, not only of Catholics but of members of various denominations desirous of a conscientious and kindly care for the morals, the health, and the intellectual advancement of their children.

The site is one of quiet beauty, lofty trees enclose the spacious and tastefully laid out pleasure-grounds, invigorating breezes from the neighbouring Hillsborough inspire both physical and mental activity, while the retired nature of the locality invites to reflection and study.
