north of Toronto, the county seat, 3 north
of Unionville, on the Mid div G T Ry, the
nearest shipping point, and 5 north of Mark-
ham, the nearest banking point. Settled in
1850. It contains Methodist and Presby-
terian churches and public school, and ships
produce and live stock. Population, 75.
Mail daily. Wm Jenkins, postmaster.

CASHION'S GLEN. Formerly known
as Cashion's Corners, is a country post office
in Charlottenburgh township, Glengarry
County, 20 miles south of Alexandria, the
county seat, and 9 north-east of Cornwall,
the nearest railway and banking point. Set-
tled in 1874. It has a public school, and ships
grain, hay and produce. Stages tri-weekly
to Cornwall, Glen Donald and Glen Walker,
fares 75c, 50c and 25c respectively. Popula-
tion, 50. Mail tri-weekly. Mrs Caroline
Cashion, postmaster.

on the River Thames (which supplies power)
in Mosa township, Middlesex County, 40
miles south-west of London, the county seat,
and 3½ east of Bothwell, on the G T Ry, the
nearest shipping and banking point. Settled
in 1800. It has a Methodist church and
common school, and ships flour and produce.
Stage tri-weekly to Clachan and Bothwell,
fare 20c to either place. Population, 50.
Mail tri-weekly. George Mansfield, post-
master.

and ships grain and brick. Population, 200.
