CAP. II.

An Act to continue an Act, intituled "An Act relating to the Herring Fisheries in the County of Charlotte." 7 W. 4, c. 36.

Passed 25th March 1840.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That an Act made and passed in the seventh year of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act relating to the Herring Fisheries in the County of Charlotte," be and the same is hereby continued and declared to be in full force until the first day of April which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty five. 7 W. 4, c. 36, continued.

CAP. III.

An Act to continue the Act for the punishment of persons who shall be guilty of the trespasses therein mentioned in the City of Saint John.

Passed 25th March 1840.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That an Act made and passed in the fifth year of the Reign of His Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for the punishment of persons who shall be guilty of the trespasses therein mentioned in the City of Saint John," be and the same is hereby continued and declared to be in force until the first day of April which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty. 5 W. 4, c. 9, continued. 2 Dec

CAP. IV.

An Act to continue the Act imposing a Duty on Rum and other Liquors distilled within the Province.

Passed 25th March 1840.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That an Act made and passed in the ninth and tenth years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act further to increase the Revenue of the Province by imposing a Duty upon all Rum and other Spirituous Liquors that shall be distilled within the same," be and the same is hereby continued and declared to be in force until the first day of April which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty five. 9 & 10 G. 4, c. 30, continued.
