RESOLVED, That this House doth concur with the Committee in the faid amendment.

ORDERED, That the faid amendment be made to the faid address.

Mr. Turgeon moved to refolve, feconded by Mr. Bertbelot,

That this Houfe doth concur in the Address to His Majesty as amended, and in the faid Memorial.

On motion of Mr. Attorney General, feconded by Mr. Young,

ORDERED. That the entry of the Royal Affent to the Act intituled, "An Act to provide for the erecting of a Common Gaol in "each of the Diffricts of *Quebec* and *Montreal* respectively, "and the means for defraying the expences thereof:" as the fame appears upon the Journal of this House of the twenty fifth day of March, 1805.—be now read.

And the fame was read accordingly by the Clerk.

On motion of Mr. Taschereau, seconded by Mr. Pyke,

ORDERED, That the thirty first Section of the Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, in the thirty-first year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act " passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, intitul-" ed, "An Act for making more effectual provision for the " government of the Province of Quebec in North America, " and to make further provision for the government of the Act province in the fourteenth and the fame was read accordingly by the Clerk.
