Latest reports from Afghanistan state that the wounded in the recent battle near Canahar are comfor ably attended to, and are doing well. The total British casualties, killed and wounded, amount to 248. In all, 32 guns have been captured, including two lost at Maiwand. Ayoob fled to Khakrez without stop-Ayoob Khan personally responsible for Lieutenant MacLaine's murder. Lieutenant MacLaines's diary, which has been found, ending August 15th, says that he was badly treated until Sirteep arrived at Ayoob's camp.

A Candahar despatch says it is reported that at the battle of Kushk-i-Nakhud the loss of the Afghans must have been enormous. The Afghans were employed for eight days after the battle in burying the dead. The health of General Roberts is quite restored. The remainder of his force leave Candahar shortly, and will be replaced by General Phayre's troops, numbering 13,000.






