Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

Any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sisten of intending homesteader.

Duties: Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his k mestea on a farm of at least 80 acre. set by wn-

Drummond-Arthabaska. The Quebec standing as a result of yesterday's polling is 36 Liberais and 27 Conservatives, with two deferred elections yet to be held in Gaspe and Chicoutimi.

Another feature of the result was the lack of strength displayed by the Nationalists in countre which seemed to be their strong hold. The Conservatives not only held their own in the majority of the constituencies represented by them in the last parliament, but they added considerably to the
