

All Single Men from Twenty to Twenty-four Must Serve

Ottawa, April 10-Owing to the critical situation which has developed on the Western Front, the Government have recog-nized that the additional men so urgently needed cannot be secured within the time required through the ordinary operation of the Military Service Act or any system of individual selection The Government have therefore decided that the only way re-inforcements can be secured in time and in sufficient number is to order out for service all men of certain defined ages. who are physically fit, and to abolish all exemptions in the case of all men so ordered out-

It is the intention to call out in the first instance unmarried men and widowers without children from 20 to 24 inclusive.
