

The apple ancker a new and investing pest was discovered in Nora Scotta in the summer of 1913. This put is a native of the ald world and is a serious apple pest, particularly in England. The insect pesses the winter in the egg stage on the host plant, and in order to prevent its distribution into new territory ou auriery stock, an Order-in-council was passed on November 28th, 1913, torbidding the alignment of apples tock from the infested ares. As a result of scouring work carried on during the past summer, this pest has been tound in certain pyrions of Kings, Hants, Colchester and Cumberland coustles in Nora Scotta. As a result of the it has been necce-sary to replace the Order-in-council passed last year by a Ministerial Order which went into effect on August 21, 1920. This order-summa-tines the counties of Kings, Hanty, Colchester and Cumberland, but provides for the movement of nur-provides for the movement of nur-bro summer, stock may be moved from bolits outside the ouarantitued No nursery stock may be moved from points outside the guarantined district unless accompanied by overtificate of inspection, and a preserve atock may be moved within misetble, however, to make such shipments within the infested area provided they ade accompanied by a permit. 
