PRIZES FOR CLEAN CROPS.
Local agricultural societies in Alberta are giving \$100 prizes for the farmer who produces the best ten acres of clean wheat. According to W. C. McKillop, the district officer of the Dominion Seed Branch, these competitions will have a far-reaching effect in improving the quality of the grain produced in the province. It is difficult to prevent the mixing of varieties of grain and the spread of weeds in a system of farming so intensive as ours. To combat this tendency, and to develop heavy yielding, early varieties, is the purpose of the agricultural societies in offering these hand-sown prizes. It is believed that by stimulating a spirit of friendly rivalry and by offering material rewards to the successful farmer, the general quality of the crops in a whole neighborhood may be effected. The support of both the provincial and Dominion governments is behind these competitions. The former gives a money grant and the latter supplies expert judges to inspect the fields. The majority of the more progressive agricultural societies in the province have already organized competitions.

FORESTRY OFFICER HERE.
R. H. Campbell, superintendent of forestry, Ottawa, and chief timber ranger Margoch came to the city last night. They are here for the purpose of conferring with the authorities regarding the advisability of placing the Canadian Forestry Commission under the direct supervision of the local land office. At present the local government lands are administered entirely in the care of the department at Ottawa. For some time past it has been felt that it would be better to have them under the control of the local land office. For instance, at present when a bush fire is reported at the local office, word has to be wired to Ottawa. Very often, before an answer is received, either the fire has made great headway, or else it has been put out by settlers and homesteaders. All the fire rangers from the surrounding country have been called in to Edmonton, and will meet Mr. Campbell, when the system of fire ranging will be discussed and improvements in prompt and efficient service suggested.

Where an efficient and up-to-date system of fire ranging is in vogue, hundreds of thousands of dollars are saved to the country every year, and too much importance cannot be placed on it.
Bridges Essential to the Work.
Ottawa, May 19.—Regarding criticisms of the Western Grain Growers, concerning work on the Hudson Bay railway, it is stated at the department that a preliminary essential is the construction of a bridge over the Saskatchewan at the Pas. TWO NEW FAST LINERS FOR CANADIAN ROUTE

Will Make a Quick Time to Quebec as Lusitania Can to New York.—New Boats Will be of 20,000 Tons, Over 21 Knots, and Carry 2,300 Passengers.
Montreal, May 19.—The expectation is that the two new Allan liners for which tenders have been called will be ready to start on the Montreal-Quebec route in about a month. The new boats will be of 20,000 tons, over 21 knots, and carry 2,300 passengers. They will be built at the Allan Line shipyard in Glasgow, Scotland, and will be ready to start on the Montreal-Quebec route in about a month. Speed 21 Knots.
According to the notices sent out by Mr. Hugh A. Allan, the new liners will be of 20,000 tons or upwards, with a speed of at least 21 knots an hour. This will probably mean that all will develop 22 knots. If they make 21 knots they will cut off exactly 22 hours from the time between Liverpool and Quebec, while if they are able to make the 22 knot speed they will reduce the time by nearly half a day more on the 2,900 mile run. The new vessels will be about 700 feet long, as compared with 660 feet, which is the length of the Queen now on the Canadian service, and will draw about 30 feet.

It is not yet known what horsepower they will develop, or their other dimensions, nor whether they will be of the reciprocating or turbine, or combination type. It is expected that the Allan simply state that they require two steamships of 20,000 tons or more, with a speed of 21 knots or more and a capacity for 2,300 passengers. It is for the time being, however, that the new vessels will be built to meet. But the provision is made in the notice sent out by Mr. Allan that the vessels must be of the highest type furnished by British workmanship, both as to safety and as to speed. The new ships will be designed to carry 400 first-class, 400 second-class and 1,600 steerage passengers, a total of 2,300. This compares with 1,800 as the largest passenger list yet carried from Great Britain to Canada, and the new ships will be able to carry 500 more passengers than the Lusitania, which is the largest ship on the Canadian route.

Canadian Mauretians.
The "new scheme," said Mr. Hanrahan, is to build two 21,000 ton Mauretians and Lusitania type for the Canadian route. MACKENZIE AND MANN MAKE FIRST PAYMENT

Quarter of Purchase Price of Dunsmuir Collieries in R.C. is Paid Over.
Dunsmuir is to Take \$2,000,000 in Stock in Company to Operate Mines.
Vancouver, B.C., May 18.—At Victoria last Saturday, Mackenzie, Mann & Co., through the negotiations of their solicitor, R. T. Elliott, made a payment of \$2,750,000, representing one-quarter of the purchase price of the Dunsmuir collieries and coal lands on Vancouver Island. James Dunsmuir is taking in part payment two million dollars of the stock in the new company recently floated in London and in which the ownership of the properties will be vested. An important stipulation in the option is that the purchasers would not be given possession until the last payment shall have been made.

Fort Francis Needs Power.
Citizens Will Not Lose it Without a Struggle.
Ottawa, Ont., May 18.—To induce the federal government to prohibit exportation of water power to the American side of Fort Francis is the mission of Mayor Herbert Williams, of that town, who is in the city today. A corporation known as the Minnesota and Ontario Power company is seeking authority from both the Federal and Provincial governments to export power from the Canadian to the American side of Rainy River at Fort Francis.
