Fattening Cows in Milk.

Fattening Cows In Milk.

Editors Country Gentleman, — Please form a profitable and economical ration for milch cows, 800 to 900 pounds each. I have good clover and timothy hay mixed; corn meal is worth \$21 per ton; bran, \$21; can-aille, \$22; cottonseed meal, \$25 to \$50; linseed meal, \$32. I am making milk for the city, and want to turn all my cows for heef, that I can make good enough before grass time. I have been feeding quite heavily with grain and good corn enslage all winter. Some of the cows are good beef now. The ensilage is all gone. Can cut hay to mix grain if profitable. Have a quantity of barley straw—can I use it to an advantage?

L. M. B. is unfortunate in running out of ensilage, since succulent food is a great aid in fattening animals as well as in the production of milk. It is inferred that his cows are of good weight, and as he is endeavoring to fatten them for market, he will require a larger ration than if he were merely producing milk. We should advise him to cut at least five pounds of his hay before mixing the grain. We should advise the following combination in the mixed portion of the ration: Five pounds of the cut clover and timothy hay, six pounds portion of the ration: Five pounds of the ceut clover and timothy hay, six pounds commaal, five pounds wheat bran and two pounds best decorticated cottonseed meal, and if he feeds no barley straw, then there will be eight pounds of long hay fed; or, if he feeds three pounds barley straw, then five pounds long hay. The digestible nutrients are shown in the following formula, in pounds:

Albumi- Carbo-noids, hydrates, Fat. 8.84 3.52 $0.59 \\ 0.10$

at will materially increase the effect of the ration, and perhaps make up for the loss of ensilage. He should not use the undecorticated cottonseed meal, as it has but little more than half the feeding value of the best quality. If he cannot get the best quality of cottonseed meal, then he had better use the linseed meal at the higher price.
