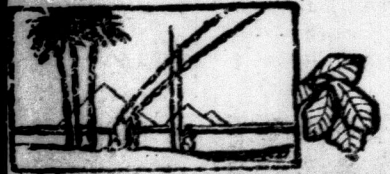

Genevieve Friedbaum, who won the prize for long hair at the New York physical culture show, displays her tresses to a friend whose hair is still rather short.



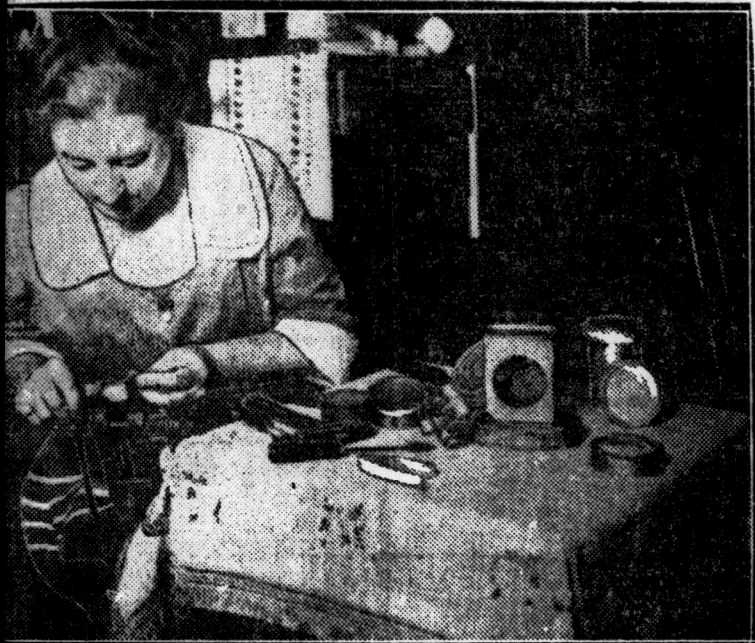

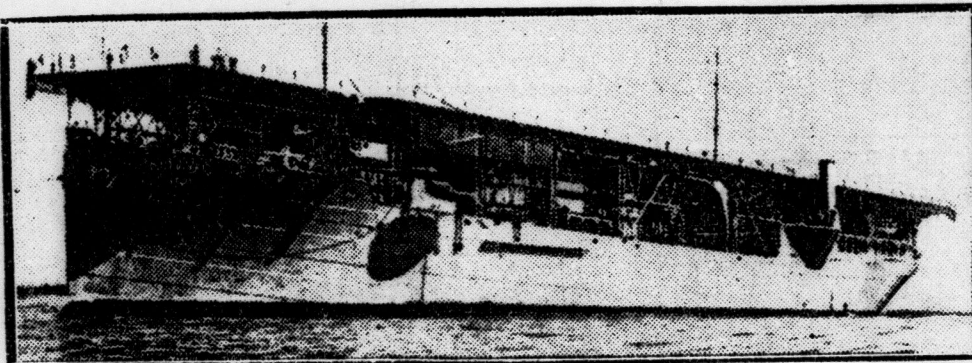
"Navigation," one of the statues in front of the new Port of London building.

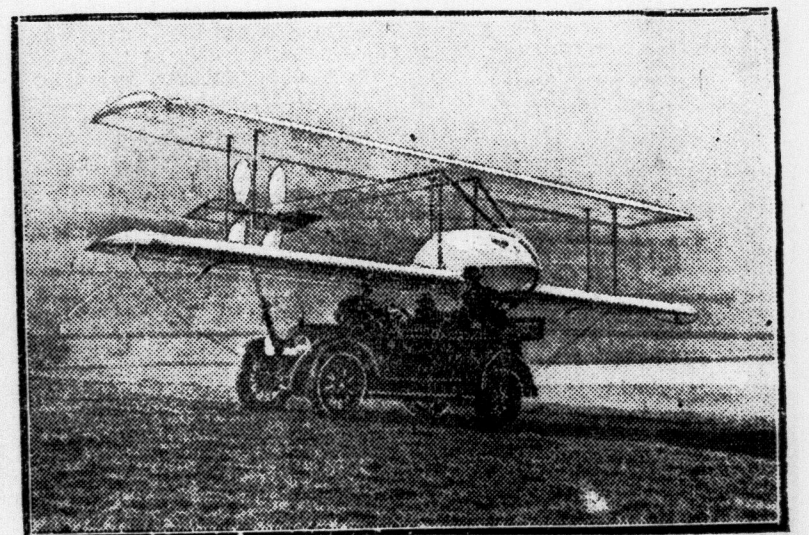
Aleanor Boardman is taking boxing lessons in Los Angeles from Jim Tully, ex-pugilist, but she hasn't learned yet not to use her feet.
