Platinum wire and resorts pans, condensers tubing and pipe made of platinum, when imported by manufacturers of sulphuric acid for use in their works in the manufac-

Silox or crystallized quartz silk raw, or as reeled from the cocoon, not being doubled, twisted or advanced in manufacture in any

Rags of cotton, linnen jute, hemp and
woolen, paper waste or clippings, and waste
of any kind except mineral waste.

Red liquor a crude acetate of aluminium
prepared from pyroligneous acid for dyeing
and calico printing.

Steel of No. 20 gauge, but not thinner than No. 30 gauge, to be used in the manufacture of corset steels, clock springs and shoe shanks and flat wire of steel of No. 16 gauge supported by file manufacturers for use in their factories.

Rubber, crude caoutchouc, or india rubber, unmanufactured, hard rubber in sheets, but not further manufactured, and re-covered rubber and rubber substitutes.

Rail, not elsewhere specified, in barrels, bags or other packages, to bear the same rate of duty as if imported empty; old tariff, 10 per cent ad valorem, but not further manufactured. Steel valued at 2-1-20 per pound and upwards for use in the manufacture of skates. Steel of No. 12 gauge and thinner, but not thinner than No. 80 gauge, when imported in shape, but not further manufactured.

Seedling stock for grafting, viz., plum, pear, peach and other fruit trees.
