New Wheat Beats Marquis

A new impetus to wheat cultivation on the Western prairies is likely to be given through the perfection of a new variety known as Garnet, which, it is estimated, will reduce the period of time between sowing and reaping to 100 days. A few years ago the usual period was 120 days, but the Marquis wheat now grown reduced it to 100 days. The Ottawa Experimental Farm has been studying the new variety for several seasons, and this year small quantities of seed were sent to about 100 selected farms in Western Canada and its record augurs well for the future of the prairies.

In Southern Alberta, Garnet wheat ripened and was threshed long before the snow and rain storms came, and in several cases Marquis wheat grown in the same fields is still unthreshed.

Very exacting tests carried out over a period of years establish the fact that Garnet is among the high-class milling and baking wheats. Two lots of 100 bushels each—one of Garnet and one of Marquis—are to se shipped to Minneapolis for further milling tests, and provided these are satisfactory the Federal Government

Locarno Treaties Endorsed
The endorsation of the Treaties of Locarno by the British House of Commons by the overwhelmning majority of 375 to 13 was something in the nature of a personal triumph for Mr. Austen Chamberlain who introduced the motion for ratification. There was some criticism of the treaty both by Mr. Lloyd George and Ramsay MacDonald, but no real opposition. No attempt was made at Locarno, Mr. Chamberlain said, to produce a scheme of world disarmament, "but not only did we do nothing to make disarmament any more difficult, but we did much to make it easier."

Princess Alexandra of Denmark, one which greatly interested the young Prince. The next day, calling upon the Duchess of Cambridge, he saw the same face in miniature on her table and thus began his first interest in his Princess. In the autumn of 1861 the Prince went to Germany, and there, in the cathedral at Speyer, he saw a party approaching him, in the midst of which was the fair face he so much admired. It was not, however, until about a year later, and after the death of the Prince Consort that Prince Albert Edward and his Royal Danish Princess were married, March 10th, 1863, after a wonderful round of factivities

The long reign of Queen Victoria closed with her death on January 22nd, 1901. The coronation of King Edward and Queen Alexandra took place in Westminster Abbey on the morning of August 9, 1902. The scene was even more brilliant than that of their wedding.

For the comparatively brief interval of barely ten years—1901-1910—Queen Alexandra adorned the position of Queen Consort at Buckingham Palace, a period full of anxious care regarding King Edward's health, after his nearly fatal illness on the eye of the Coronation in 1901. At that time, it will be remembered, the Coronation had to be postponed.

Last Sunday morning the body of the Queen Mother was borne by four of her old servants to the little church at Sandringham, where a private service was conducted in the
