RETURNS BY PARISHES.

By the directions of the Board of Management the returns sent by parishes and stations are given above in tabulated form. They do not correspond with the amounts published above by the General Treasurer, because some items are included in the tabulated returns which did not actually pass through the Treasurer's hands, but which were, nevertheless, raised in the Dioceses and Parishes specified. In time, it is hoped, the two returns will more nearly correspond. In the Diocese of Fredericton, for instance, the amounts received and forwarded to the different missionary objects specified, were not all received by our Treasurer, but were simply reported to the Board. It is satisfactory, however, to know that Fredericton has now arranged to deal with the Society as the other dioceses do. The dates, also, do not correspond with the dates shown in the Treasurer's statement. Nor do the Dioceses in every case make up their returns covering the same financial year. These discrepancies for the present are unavoidable.
