Our Leghorns are all bred from stock imported from the United States.

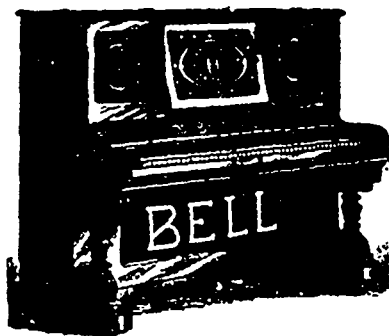
We imported in 1889 two Cockerels from New York, costing \$13.
