WHEREAS circumstances have rendered it expedient to effect certain changes in the policy of the Government respecting the ad-anistration of Domin ton Lands. PUBLIL NOTICE is hereby given:

1 The Regula ions of the 14th October, 1877 or the hereby rescinded, and the following Regulators for the disposal of agricultural lands are substituted therefor:
