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Acting upon a report from C. Schrieber,  
Deputy Minister of Railways and Canals,  
after an inspection of the rail mill at Sault Ste.  
Marie, Ont., that steel rails of the best quality,  
made out of steel manufactured in Canada,  
were being turned out to meet the ordi-  
nary requirements of the Canadian market,  
the Governor-General-in-Council, under the  
authority of sec. 1, chap. 15, 1903, by pro-  
clamation has declared that a duty of \$7 a  
ton shall be collected upon all iron and steel  
railway bars or rails in any form for railways  
imported into Canada.
